



DRAW YOUR DESIGN SUPPLY LIST

Watercolor: Any watercolor set is fine. Amy's colors are on the next page.

Watercolor paper: Amy prefers Blick Hot Press, but any paper that specifically says it's for watercolor is fine

Pencil and eraser: kneadable gum eraser is ideal

Watercolor brush: Amy used a Princeton Velvetouch Long Round 14, but any brush is fine

Any waterproof ink pen: Amy used a Faber Castell Pitt Artist calligraphy pen in Pink Carmine #127

Other good choices: Any Faber Castell Pitt or Pigma Micron pen, or even a ballpoint pen as long as it's waterproof.

OPTIONAL: Dip pens and ink: These are great fun to play with!

The Speedball No. 5 Artist's Set is a great starter dip pen set, but any dip pen will work.

Examples of waterproof inks for dip pens include:

DeAtramentis Document Inks, which can also go in fountain pens

Dr. Ph. Martin's India Inks or any India ink, which are only for dip pens or brushes

Daler Rowney acrylic inks or any acrylic ink, which are only for dip pens or brushes

AMY STEWART'S WATERCOLOR WHEEL

Amy arranges her watercolor palette according to a CMYK color wheel, which uses yellow, cyan (turquoise or blue-green), and magenta as primary colors. The colors listed here are from Daniel Smith
